7.2.	<b>Research Project</b> The following aspects of the project will be considered in the evaluation of the written submission: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Planning and execution – the practical and theoretical approach, particularly in relation to previously published work</li> <li>(ii) Presentation – organisation of the report, following the required format; use of graphs, tables and diagrams</li> <li>(iii) Evaluation of the project – a critical assessment of the study, soundness of discussion and use of statistical tests where appropriate</li> </ul>
